shakiness

dead pixels

wrong settings

shutter problems

close-up / distant settings

lack of focus

Spoilers That Cannot Be Undone

Definite Spoilers

Things you cannot correct later

- 1) Blur
- 2) Chopped-off bits

Examples Of Definite Spoilers










Out-of-Focus - Too Close!

Blurred - too close



Solutions:

- 1) Move away from the object
- 2) Use MACRO button (if you have one)

Out-of-Focus - Too Far!

Blurred - focussed on something else



this is focused on my grubby window

Out-of-Focus - Background Wins!

Blurred - focussed on something else



focused on the blue bucket

What TWO things are wrong with this shot?



- 1 chopped
- 2 not focused on me
- 3 strange shot of what ??

Another type of blur - due to movement


Movement of what?

camera shake

the object is moving

The Viewfinder and Focus-Area


Auto-focus



- 1) Focus on the subject
- 2) Compose the shot

If in doubt, put the subject DEAD CENTRE! And don't worry about number 2 (No professional will tell you this!) Where is the Focus Area?

1) Focus on the subject


Is the subject DEAD CENTRE?







Avoiding Movement Blur

Avoiding movement blur

Practice holding the camera steady

Take several shots - one may turn out well

Maybe lean against a solid object (lamp-post, fence, wall, ground) or use a tripod

Avoid quickly-moving objects or take them coming towards you more than passing you

Pan your camera if they pass you, so the background is blurred

Take pictures where it is brighter

Use a flash
